

## **Veteran Vespa Club Hertford Rally 2008 Hotel List**

Below are some ideas regarding budget hotels in or near Hertford; prices obviously are current & may increase. As far as we can make out these prices include breakfast.

1. Travelodge do not have a hotel in Hertford but do in the following nearby locations: Hatfield - 7.2 miles from Hertford, Harlow - 7.8miles from Hertford & Cheshunt - 7.9 miles from Hertford. They offer a 'Saver' rate from £19.00 per night; this is subect to availability at time of booking & has to be booked in advance via the internet only & is not refundable or transferable. A 'Flexible' rate is also offered from £46.00 per night; can be booked by internet or phone up to the day of arrival. Price seems to be the cheapest that I've found, particularly saver rate, although locations not great if riding back at night or day come to that from the rally site. 2. Fanshaws Barn is in what seems a pretty village called Brickendon approx 4 miles south of Hertford. This looks very pleasant (particularly if you don't go in for the chain hotel formula); it is a 17th century grade 2 listed barn conversion, single rooms are from £25 - £35.00, doubles are £50.00, parking doesn't seem to be an issue. 3. The Ram Inn is in central Hertford & is a pub/B&B. It looks reasonable enough from the pictures, twin rooms from £70.00 per night (single occupancy £40.00 when available). Couldn't see any mention of parking facilities. Website is [www.ramminnhertford.co.uk](http://www.ramminnhertford.co.uk) tel: 01992 583876.

4. The Salisbury Arms Hotel is also in central Hertford & is the town's "oldest hostelry" & seems to double as a pub/restaurant & hotel. There are 31 rooms starting from £44.50 for a single & £89.00 for a double, parking is available to guests.
